

From the Headteacher

Welcome to our June newsletter.

I hope you are enjoying the sunshine! It has been an incredibly busy month as we have supported over 550 students through examinations. Thank you to all parents, carers, staff, and invigilators for your support and hard work during this period.

On Thursday evening (27 June), the parents and carers of the Year 7 students who are starting in September got their first chance to come into school. We explained what life would be like for a new Year 7 student at SMRT. Thank you to all the staff and students who took part, and to those staff behind the scenes who organised the evening. We are looking forward to seeing the new Year 7 students themselves on one of the two Induction Days, when they come in for an exciting day of sample lessons. We have communicated with families directly to inform them of their specific induction day.

Our Year 11 and Year 13 students finished their GCSE and A Level exams last week. It was lovely to see many Year 11 students and their families at their leavers' service on Tuesday 25 June in St Mary Redcliffe Church. It was a wonderful celebration of their time at SMRT. We also held our fantastic Year 11 Prom that evening.

Next September

The school will be welcoming Year 7 and Year 12 students back after the holidays on Tuesday 03 September. The other year groups will return on Wednesday 04 September. These days are a period of induction for students who are new to the school, and an opportunity for us to set out our expectations for the year ahead to the whole school community.

Uniform

Monkhouse, our uniform suppliers have asked us to let parent/carers know that you are now able to book in-store appointments, in addition to the current 'walk in' arrangements. This will mean that you can avoid a queue and their staff will be able to advise you about sizing. Appointments can be booked up to a month in advance. Friends of SMRT

Friends of SMRT is the name we give to the equivalent of the PTA you might be familiar with from your children's Primary Schools. Everyone has automatic, free membership! The committee meets termly, and all are welcome to attend. The committee are elected in Term 2, at their Annual General Meeting. Free School Meal Holiday Vouchers

Bristol City Council (BCC) have contacted us about the Household Support Fund which they receive from the government, who extended this provision until September 2024. A large proportion of this money is used to provide supermarket vouchers for the families of eligible Free School Meal pupils during holiday periods. BCC's Strategy and Resources committee have agreed to use the fund to award grants of £45 per pupil for the upcoming summer holiday period. They have recognised that this is a reduced rate compared to previous years due to the limited six-month extension until September.

BCC understand that this may cause real challenges for families over the school holidays. If you know someone who is struggling, there is further information and support on BCC's dedicated cost of living webpage. The We Are Bristol phoneline is also available on 0800 694 0184 between 8.30am to 5pm, Monday to Friday.

BCC do not yet know details about the future of the Household Support Fund beyond September 2024 when the fund is expected to end. This will be the decided by the future government after the general election on Thursday 4 July and there will be further updates then.

My thanks go to our admin team at SMRT who work hard to ensure that these vouchers get sent to the correct families in a timely manner.

New Attendance Guidance

There has been a significant **national** change regarding penalty notice fines for school attendance that we need to make you aware of.

- The **first** time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term-Time Leave of Absence or irregular attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child (if paid within 28 days) Reduced to: £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term-Time Leave of Absence or irregular attendance to the same parent for the same child the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child (if paid within 28 days) There is no reduction in the amount.
- The **third** time an offence is committed for a Term-Time Leave of Absence or irregular attendance by the same parent for the same child (including those by other Local Authorities) a Penalty Notice will NOT be issued but will be referred to Bristol City Council's Education Welfare service for Prosecution which may result in fines of up to £2,500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in a Magistrate's Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate.

We have enclosed two documents from Bristol City Council:

- 1. What you need to know if your child is absent (unauthorised) during term time valid from September 2024 onwards
- 2. School Attendance: The law is changing from 19th August 2024.

We offer a significant level of support for students who are struggling with attendance. Please contact your child's tutor if you have any concerns or need support. Our website will be updated in line with the new quidance.

Community News

We had good news from a parent about ex-student Chay Mullins, who left in 2018 to attend SGS college. Chay has secured a place in the Irish rugby sevens team attending the Paris Olympics in July 2024 and has also secured a professional contract with Connacht Rugby Club. This is an impressive achievement.

It will soon be time to say goodbye to those members of teaching staff who are retiring, leaving us for new promoted posts, or posts elsewhere, or whose temporary contracts are coming to an end. There will be a summary of those who are leaving in the final newsletter of the year, and we will introduce our new staff early in September.

Introduction from Mr Morgan – Deputy Headteacher (Behaviour, Inclusion, and Ethos)

Dear Parents and Carers,

As you read this newsletter, I will have just completed my first month at SMRT. It's been a very busy month full of new challenges and I am very pleased to be in post before the start of the new academic year.

Last week I spoke to Years 7 to 10 in assembly, focusing on our Alive value of the term: Justice and Respect. At the start of the assembly, I said a few words to introduce myself and why I decided to join SMRT. I thought it would be good to share them with you too. I worked in my last school for nearly 20 years, as an Assistant Headteacher for nearly a decade; I loved the school and the role, but I felt that it might be time for a new challenge. This role was the only one I was interested in moving schools for, and I shared with the students three of the reasons why SMRT really stood out to me. Firstly: it is really a special place. Bringing together students from all over the city and far beyond, every day into this amazing community of young people bound together through their daily shared experiences and routines is truly unique. Secondly: every school has values or mottos that encapsulate their purpose, but at SMRT those values stand out a mile – the Alive values and the 'three circles' – as they focus on the whole person, their personal and moral growth, and, most importantly, hope in God is right at the centre. Thirdly: the school strongly resources pastoral care and specialist support, which shows how much the school cares for its students. So, I was sold! I thought it was important to share that with students because we all get used to our surroundings, complacent even, and it's important to be proud about the place where you belong.

In this last month, whilst getting myself accustomed to a new environment, we have been reviewing our behaviour and uniform codes to help make them both simpler and clearer. I will follow up shortly with some more information for parents and carers that you will need to know to help your young person be 'September ready'.

Maths Spread Evaluation

Raising awareness of testicular torsion

Testicular torsion is a time-critical emergency where a testicle twists, cutting off the blood supply and causing sudden scrotal pain. The testicle can die within six hours without emergency surgery.

With torsion occurring in 1 in 1,000 boys aged 10-20 NHS England, the Getting It Right First Time (GIRFT) programme is working to raise awareness and improve education among young people, parents/carers and teachers to ensure boys experiencing severe testicular pain and other symptoms of torsion can recognise the signs and understand to act quickly. As a school we will be working to raise awareness amongst staff and students. Please do reinforce this with your children as relevant.


