Subject: Health & Social Care

SMRT 6th Form takes students from a wide range of schools, who have studied a variety of GCSE and BTEC syllabuses. We want to ensure that everybody is equally able to access the content of the Level 3 BTEC qualification and so the following tasks give you a chance to ensure you are fully prepared.

At SMRT we have used the Pearson Level 2 Technical Award in Health and Social Care but most of our students at Level 3 will not have done the subject before, so you should not need to worry about this.

To ensure you are ready to fully access the Level 3 BTEC Syllabus you should attempt the following task on Human Development and Providing Quality Care

Task 1: Design a resource that explain the different areas of human growth and development. This could be in the form of a mind map, poster, PowerPoint, etc. It needs to explain the four areas of development; Physical, Intellectual, Emotional and Social (PIES). You need to define these key terms and give detailed examples. Use the internet to research the meaning of each and for some examples. Task 2: Investigate how one organisation ensures that the care provided is of the highest quality.

Windmill Care Homes run three care homes in South Gloucestershire, **The Meadows**, **Windmill House** and **Osbourne Court**. Windmill House is a residential care home for elderly people. Osbourne Court provides specialist care for residents living with various forms of Dementia. Use the website: www.windmillcare.com to research how care is provided at **Osbourne Court**.

The following questions will help you to focus your research.

NB: Please do not contact the Care Home directly. All information you need for this task is available on the web-site.

- Windmill Care Homes are a **service provider**. For whom are they providing the service?
- What facilities are provided at Osbourne Court?
- How does Staff at Osbourne Court ensure that the residents are well nourished?
- What activities are made available to the residents? How might residents of Osbourne Court benefit from these activities?
- Osbourne Court specialises in care for people living with Dementia. What are the main features of the care staff provide for each individual?
- Imagine that you are the manager of Osbourne Court. How would you ensure that you employ people who are going to provide excellent quality care to the residents and uphold the values of Windmill Care Homes?
